The author, a member of the Mekusukey band of the Seminole Nation tribe, includes his own recipe for fry bread in the back of the book.</p>

Roper</i></p> <p>Sailors have always told tales of terrifying sea monsters, but it took many years for scientists to realize the monsters really exist! Follow scientist Clyde Roper as he faces the challenge of studying an animal that has hardly ever actually been seen.</p>





	<p>Inspector Flytrap</p> <p><i>By Tom Angleberger and Cece Bell</i></p> <p>In this illustrated chapter book, the very important detective Inspector Flytrap solves several “big deal” mysteries involving a kidnapped rose, a stinky bakery, and a mysterious blob. 	<p>The Last Last-Day-of-Summer</p> <p><i>By Lamar Giles</i></p> <p>Cousins and super sleuths Otto and Sheed Alston just want one more day of summer vacation. Then their wish comes true, thanks to a mysterious stranger with a camera that can freeze time, and suddenly the cousins are caught up in an epic struggle between good and evil (and a fuzzy platypus). 	<p>Lucky Broken Girl</p> <p><i>By Ruth Behar</i></p> <p>This story is based on the author’s own life experience as a young Cuban-Jewish immigrant living in New York in the 1960’s. Fifth-grader Ruth is just starting to feel comfortable with her new home and new language when a car accident traps her in a body cast. 

	<p>Moon Girl and Devil Dinosaur 1: BFF</p> <p><i>By Amy Reeder and Brandon Montclair, Pictures by Natacha Bustos</i></p> <p>Fourth-grader Lunella Lafayette is a supergenius, but she also has an “inhuman” gene that could turn her into a mutant at any moment. So when a savage, red-scaled T-Rex from the prehistoric past is suddenly transported to the present, the only logical thing for Lunella to do is to team up with Devil Dinosaur to save the world.
